

#### Message from the Chair of the Program Committee

Thank-you for joining us for the 45<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference of the Canadian Sex Research Forum in Toronto, Ontario. With gratitude and respect, I acknowledge that we are holding our meeting on the traditional territories of the Anishinabek Nation, Mississaugas of the New Credit First Nation, the Haudenosaunee Confederacy, Wendat, and Métis Nations. We recognize the enduring presence of Indigenous people on and of these lands. As a new leader in the organization, I would like to encourage personal, professional, and organizational reflection on our responsibilities for reconciliation with Indigenous peoples and decolonization.



The Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada report was released in 2015. It contains 94 calls to action, including the provision of culturally relevant services to overcome experiences of sexual abuse and a request for an apology from the Pope for the Roman Catholic Church's role in the sexual abuse of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis children in Catholic-run residential schools. This apology was denied earlier this year.

CSRF's vision is to be Canada's leading organization fostering sexual science and improving the sexual health and well-being of Canadians. Over the course of the conference, I ask you to think about our individual and collective role in Canadian reconciliation.

This is one of our fullest conference programs to date. We have over 60 oral presentations, including two symposiums and a range of full oral (20 minute), short oral (10 minute), and data blitz (5 minute) talks. We also have over 50 poster presentations, which have been split across two end-of-day receptions on Thursday and Friday. Thanks to all our presenters!

Last, I would like to thank all of the people who helped plan and make this conference possible: our local hosts Amy Muise and Morag Yule, the Program Committee and Executive Council, and especially our Executive Director Lisa Dawn Hamilton. I would like to also personally thank and recognize our sponsors this year, including the Sex Information & Education Council of Canada, Good for Her, and James Cantor. They make the conference possible, especially the student awards. Thank-you to our session moderators and anonymous student presentation judges.

Thank you for coming to CSRF 2018. We hope you'll find the meeting both professionally enriching and socially engaging. This is a special opportunity to be together and learn from one another. Please listen carefully, think critically, and engage in respectful constructive dialogue. Enjoy the conference!

CSRF After Dark has become an annual tradition at CSRF where we offer a less formal, more experiential learning session about a topic in sexuality. This year, we are proposing CSRF Before Dark which will involve a facility tour, information session and kink performance at Oasis Aqualounge, a sex club in Toronto. For this event, CSRF would have exclusive (private) access to the club. Oasis' mission is to: "provide its members with an upscale, sexually liberated and clothing-optional space that caters to the needs of women and their partners. We provide a setting where couples can connect emotionally and sexually to enhance their relationships. For women, we offer a safe, judgment-free environment where they can explore their sexual curiosities with opportunities to interact with other women, couples and single men, depending on the event."


The plan for the Before Dark event at Oasis is to walk to the club (the club is only 300m and a 4minute walk from the conference venue). See directions and map below. Our group has exclusive access to the club for the duration of our visit. At the club, we will break into smaller groups; the setup is not conducive to our entire group being in the same space, so we will participate in smaller groups for the tour, information session and performance. Here are more details on the activities:

- Dylan, the manager at Oasis, will give an information session on the stage in the Ballroom where he will provide information about the club and their various events.
- Fatima and Geena as well as other employees will lead smaller group tours of the venue. They will also be on hand to provide information and answer questions.
- A rope bondage performance will take place in the Dungeon area. Similar shows take place at Oasis on certain nights and this would provide our group with an example of the entertainment at Oasis as well as another activity during our visit.

All activities and participation in this Before Dark are optional. Given the nature of the space that we will be entering, we wanted to inform folks that they might be exposed to sexually explicit imagery (on the walls).


# CSRF Inaugural Awards Gala – Saturday 6:30pm – 9:00pm
