## Message from the Chair of the Scientific Program Committee

This year marks the Canadian Sex Research Forum's 43<sup>rd</sup> annual conference, and my 18<sup>th</sup> consecutive year of attendance. In 1999, I was one of only 2 students in attendance amongst a few dozen members. This year will be our largest annual meeting to date, with more than 80 students presenting posters and oral presentations and more than half of our oral talks coming from non-student members.



I hope you will come to agree with me that this year will also see some of the most robust science we've ever had the privilege of presenting at CSRF. Interest in our meeting keeps growing, and this year the number of abstract submissions smashed our previous record by more than 70%! The Scientific Program Committee has worked hard to bring you research from a wide range of areas, some rarely seen before at CSRF. This year's talks feature everything from methodological considerations in research, experimental and clinical populations, case-reports and large samples, youth and mid-life issues, pregnancy, diverse populations, and much, much more. We'll even be reflecting inwards to look at the type of content presented at recent past meetings.

In order to facilitate our growing meeting, this year we'll be introducing a new presentation format: the data blitz. A data blitz is a group of fast, exciting, concise talks, each presented with just 5 slides in only 5 minutes. These presentations have been popular at other meetings such as the Society for Personality and Social Psychology and many others, and are often the most anticipated and well-attended talks. These talks give scholars the chance to highlight their latest and greatest findings in a quick, fun, and accessible format. Of course, we'll always have our full oral talks for those that love diving into the details. With so many excellent abstracts submitted this year, please be sure to grab a drink and spend some time perusing posters. Some of the best science at our meeting will be presented in that format.

It takes dozens of very special people to bring this meeting together every year, each of whom is dedicated to helping CSRF advance our vision and mission. Special thanks to Jocelyn Wentland, Secretary of your Executive Council, for acting as local host for the second consecutive year, despite living on the other side of the country. Lisa Dawn Hamilton, our Executive Director, has been instrumental and expert in running the day-to-day operations of our organization and our annual meeting. Without their intense involvement, this meeting would not have happened. Thank you also to the other members of your Executive Council – Martin Lalumiere, Lori Brotto, Nathan Lachowsky, Chelsea Kilimnik, and Drake Levere – for sharing your experience, input and support. Finally, a great deal of gratitude goes out to our moderators, Abstract Review Committee members, and student award judges.

We hope you'll spend the next few days learning something, teaching something, catching up with colleagues and acquainting yourself with new ones. Most of all, we hope you'll have fun in this historic setting and start making plans to spend time with us again next year, and beyond.
