



CRIPCAS programming focuses on sexual abuse and intimate relationship problems, social issues that are recognized as priorities at the provincial level (Government Strategy to Prevent and Counter Sexual Violence 2016-2021, Government Action Plan on Domestic Violence 2018 -2023), the national level (Canada's Strategy to Prevent and Counter Gender-based Violence, 2017) and at the international level (WHO Global Campaign for Violence Prevention, 2012-2020).

While each of these themes poses complex research questions in and of themselves, one of the ambitions of CRIPCAS researchers is to examine the interrelations to make a unique contribution to the understanding of these two issues.

Our recent studies have shown that: (1) sexual abuse and co-occurrence of abuse (abuse, neglect) affect the development of children who are victims of abuse and (2) into adulthood, they are at risk of presenting difficulties in dating and intimate relationships, as well as physical and psychological health problems.
